## July Speaker

Patrick Emmons, Scuba Instructor, UTA

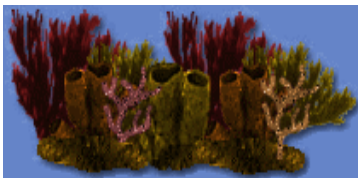
Mr. Emmons will provide a segway from the advanced cave diving that Steve Cushman discussed last month to some of the academic certifications to achieve those feats and other advanced topics. Some of you may have met him when he visited in May. And here is a little more about him.

Mr. Patrick Emmons is the Technical Scuba Diving instructor at University Scuba ([www.universityscuba.org](http://www.universityscuba.org)). Pat is a certified NAUI (National Association of Underwater Instructors) instructor, a TDI (Technical Diving International) instructor and has been diving professionally since 1998. At the age of 65, Pat has over 20 years of scuba diving experience and over 1000 hours of diving experience. One of his primary goals as an instructor is to share the experience with older adults. Pat began his career as a diver in February 1986. Pat's initial diving experiences included the exploration of water filled mines in the mid west around St. Louis, which fueled his passion for the sport of scuba diving. In the mid 1990s, Pat enrolled in the scuba program at the University of Texas at Arlington to begin work on his professional scuba diver ratings. Pat completed his NAUI scuba instructor rating in August of 2000. Pat is credited with the creation of interactive Microsoft PowerPoint presentations for the University Scuba curriculum. Pat is also an instructor in Nitrox, Introduction to Technical Diving, Advanced Nitrox, Decompression Procedures, Extended Range, underwater photography and CPR/First Aid. Pat's diverse and unique diving experiences canvas the globe to include: The Great Lakes, Bonne Terre lead mine, Puget Sound, Cozumel Mexico, Harbour Island Bahamas, Curacao and Bonaire Netherlands Antilles, Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, Belize, Guam, Palau and Truk Lagoon (Chuuk Island) in the south Pacific.

My favorite dive buddy: My wife Laura. She first became a certified diver in 1997. Laura is a master diver with over 200 dives.

Most memorable dive: A midnight dive on Haps reef in Guam with only my wife, a Divemaster and myself. The full moon illuminated the underwater reef teeming with beautiful Spanish Dancers, Lion Fish and Candy Cane shrimp. My wife and I swam effortlessly in the warm gentle sea, bathing in the moonlight and the solitude making for a totally memorable experience

## Balmorhea State Park Outing Report May 24 – 26

Thirteen Diving Rebels Members and friends met at the American Airlines Corporate Offices Parking Garage on Friday May 23<sup>rd</sup> at 8:00pm to pack the trailers for the drive to Balmorhea State Park. Many thanks to Keith and Danny for providing the use of their vehicles and trailers for the journey. The group departed at approximately 9pm. We made stops in Abilene and Monahans before taking a longer stop in Pecos, where we visited the local Wal-Mart at 4am before enjoying breakfast at the Flying J.

Our final leg of the journey provided a scenic sunrise over the Davis Mountains with our arrival at Balmorhea State Park at approximately 7am. It was a cool morning, but the sun began to heat the air quickly. We met with Chris and Melissa from Austin who had arrived Friday night. We thank them for joining us and enjoyed diving with our new friends from Austin. They had grabbed a great camping spot and soon the spot next to them opened up and the group began making camp.

The gear was loaded into the vehicles and off to dive San Solomon Springs went the group. The water was a cool 74 degrees but felt great once the initial creeping into the wetsuit concluded. Mark and Jim provided a great lunch which we enjoyed at the springs after we dove. The afternoon was spent diving and several members could be seen catching cat naps under the shade of the trees.

After a wonderful evening meal of Lo Mein prepared by Keith, most of the group departed for the Mc Donald Observatory. It was a beautiful night for star gazing. As some observed Saturn, Mars and star clusters thru the many telescopes, others stayed in the amphitheatre for a constellation tour and laid back and looked at the sky full of stars as the guide pointed to a variety of constellations. At 10:23pm, we were fortunate to watch the Hubble Telescope cross the sky above us. The groups then switched so others could view thru the telescopes and learn of the constellations.

On Sunday, a wonderful breakfast of waffles and bacon was prepared by Nick and Paula. After breakfast it was back to the springs for half the group while the other half returned to the Mc Donald Observatory for a tour of the much larger telescopes. That afternoon, after a dive, we were greeted by a dust storm which had formed due to some thunderstorms in the area. Once it blew thru, the winds calmed and we enjoyed a great meal of barbeque chicken, potato salad and beans prepared by Danny and Jill. After dinner, 10 divers enjoyed a night dive while others sat around and enjoyed the beautiful star filled night.

Ted and Lisa provided breakfast on Monday as the group broke camp. We departed around 11am for DFW, and after a stop at Sand Hills State Park in Monahans for lunch, we continued our journey home arriving around 8pm.

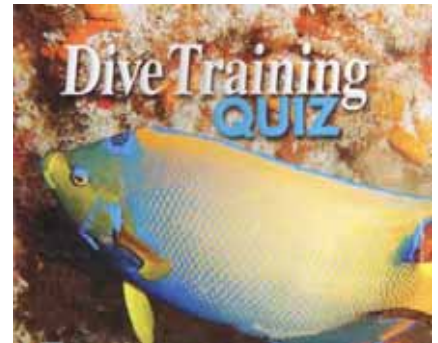

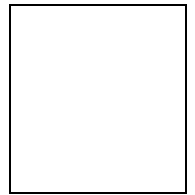
